Differentiated assessment is the way by which teachers modify and match assessment with the varied characteristics/profiles of students in order to meet the students' individual needs, thereby enhancing their learning and boosting their ability to show what they have learned.

At that moment, you choose about five or six students who do not have to make the test, but form the assessment committee. While the others go to work, the commission makes a check model. When to Assess. Effective differentiation requires teachers to assess student status before a unit of study begins (pre-assessment), throughout the unit of study (formative or ongoing assessment), and at key ending or wrap-up points in a unit of study (summative assessment).

Assessment and Differentiation: A Framework for Understanding

The word assessment often is used to assess skills, abilities, aptitude, performance, and competence. For examples, the teacher assesses the performance of students in various subjects to assess the abilities and IQ level of students and help students to improve their performance. From Differentiated Instruction to Differentiated Assessment

By self-assessing, each child is learning how he/she learns. The task of differentiated instruction may be that of the teacher; however, empowering students to use what they know about how they learn (metacognition) helps them become self-differentiating learners. Assessment is the bridge that allows teachers and students to differentiate learning.
